Commodore Charlotte Walker said, "Conditions were nearly perfect on Saturday ending our eight days of activities for the Regatta on a high note. It was sunny with strong winds from the northeast averaging about 15 knots with gusts up to 20 knots or more. One vessel in Class C, Native Dancer, skippered by Hal Winard, did lose its steering and was not able to finish the race. Also one of our Schooners, Schooner Estrela, snagged "ghost debris" and was stalled until its crew was able to free the vessel."

Walker continued, "Otherwise the races were finished without incident. We congratulate all captains and crews and look forward to hosting them again in 2011."

The Regatta is like no other competitive sailing event on Cape Cod, combining competitive events for historic as well as modern vessels including one-design competitions. Taking place in picturesque and historic Provincetown Harbor, the town and harbor provide a context that reinforces the links between our local maritime history, fishing vessels, sailing, the great resources of our region, our culture and our economy. Working in tandem with cultural and research institutions in Provincetown and Cape Cod, we educate the public about the schooner races held off the New England coast from 1886 to 1938, and commemorate Provincetown's 1907 Lipton Cup victory. The Regatta shares the story of Provincetown's place in the traditional fishing industry as well as educates the younger generations about the days of Cape Cod's past. The Regatta will take place from September 3<sup>rd</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup>, 2010 with the famous Schooner race, The Challenge for the Fishermen's Cup from Gloucester to Provincetown, taking place on September 7<sup>th</sup>.
